## 2012 Shelter Facts

**3,131** animals were placed into loving forever homes.

**1,200** active volunteers gave **16,000** hours to our animals.

**112** foster volunteers took 758 animals with special needs into their homes for care prior to being put up for adoption.

More than **1,000** students in 30 schools and youth groups in the Lansing area experienced CAHS humane education presentations in their classrooms.

More than **75** children, ages 8-14 years, joined Children for Humane Animal Treatment (CHAT) Club at our shelter, where they were provided the opportunity to get involved through animal handling, lessons about responsible pet ownership, and fun activities.

Over **100** children, ages 8-14 years, were members of Off-Site CHAT Club, offered at community centers in low-income neighborhoods of Lansing. Discussion topics featured at meetings included safety, overpopulation, responsible ownership, and animal cruelty.

**153** children, ages 4-16 years, attended nine summer camps where they were introduced to animal welfare through games, activities, and obedience/clicker training.

**574** animals were vaccinated at no-charge at our Pet Fairs at community centers in low-income areas of Lansing and Eaton County.



## Cruelty Stories



### Henry

In April 2012, 353 small breed dogs were confiscated from a home in Allegan County in deplorable condition. CAHS brought 17 of these dogs back to Lansing for care. Because they were scared and unsocialized, many were placed into foster homes. Shortly after becoming available for adoption, all 17 Allegan dogs were placed into forever homes, including Henry, who is reported by his mom to have an incredible personality and fit in with her family immediately.

### Cricket

In December 2012, 17 dogs and 2 cats were found in a home in Clinton County. Over the course of the investigation, six Tibetan Spaniels and two cats found safety with CAHS. We are happy to report that all eight animals have been adopted and are thriving in their new homes.



## Capital Improvements

In 2012, we were happy to have made multiple improvements to our shelter, offering a better life for the animals in our care.

In order to ensure safety for all dogs outside, donor funds allowed for the purchase and placement of brick pavers along all of the fence lines, so dogs will stay within their own yard.

Until 2012, temperament testing, enrichment, and dog interactions happened in the same room as our educational camps and after-school programs. When one activity was going on, another had to wait. By removing carpet and replacing it with tile that can be washed and sanitized, donations helped turn what used to be staff space into an area to benefit the animals we serve.

In January of 2012, thanks to funding by the Capital Region Community Foundation and several anonymous donors, we were able to expand the kitten nursery, which originally included 12 cages that were old, had pieces missing, and were too small for the number of kittens housed in them. Expansion allowed for 21 new cages with better ventilation and capacity to house 100 kittens at a time. We are now able to take in more kittens, keep them off of the streets, and instead place them into loving forever homes.

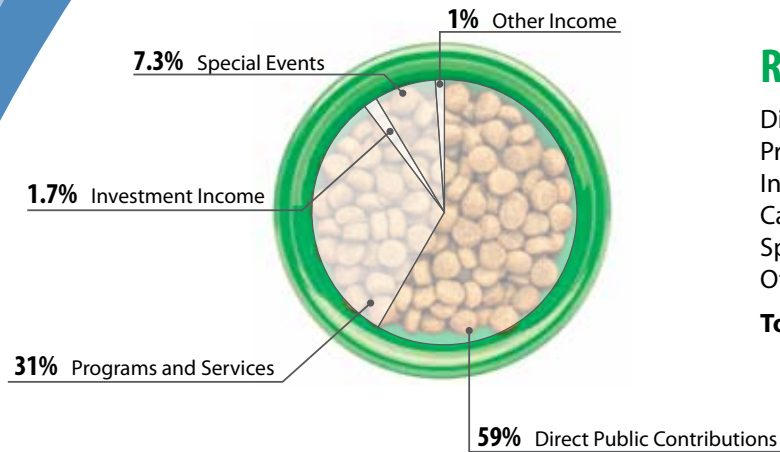

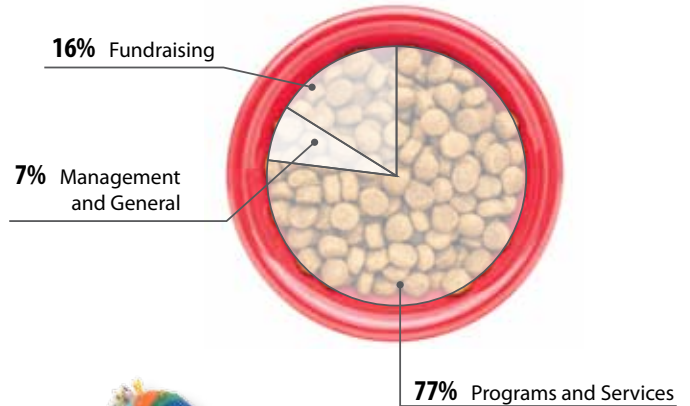
